Dr. Erandika Gunawardena, the immediate past president of SLVA also organized a vaccination and consultation program in Negombo. Several private companies related to companion animal

veterinary industry donated medical items and dog/cat food items for the program. The vets attached to the Municipalities were very enthusiastic in organizing the clinics. Several dogs and cats were vaccinated against rabies, dispensed worm treatments and also consultations/basic treatments done, benefitting underprivileged people and animals.





Workshop on Fish Health Management

The SLVA successfully organized a training program on *Fish Health Management*, in collaboration with the Center for Aquatic Animal Disease Diagnosis and Research (CAADDR), FVMAS, University of Peradeniya. 
Webinar Series on Scientific Writing for Veterinarians


